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CHAPTER - 1

1.1. INTRODUCTION

In a backward state like Assam, small-scale industries have a big role to play. The development of small industries not only mobilises local resources but also increases income and generates employment opportunities. Cottage and small industries have great importance in an agrarian economy like Assam. Rural agricultural families of the state get subsidiary occupation from these village industries. As these industries require minimum capital and ordinary tools and implements, these rural families can run these industries without investing much capital.

At the national level, in the industrial policy resolution of 1948 and 1956, the small industrial sector was given special role for creating additional employment with low capital investment.
